

**HFG Questions for**  
**“The Ultimate Examination” --Pt. II**  
**(2 Cor. 13:5 & 1 John)**

**1.** Why is it so important that we examine our own salvation? What Scripture would you use to back up your reasons?

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**2. TEST #1: Do you enjoy ongoing fellowship with God? (1 John 1:3)**  
 What does it mean to have fellowship with God? What are some ways you can cultivate that fellowship as a believer?

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**3. TEST #2: Do you walk in the Light? (1 John 1:5-7)**  
 What does the Bible mean by our “walk”? What does the Bible mean by light and darkness? Is it possible for a believer to slip into darkness at times? If so, what are some ways to get back to walking in the Light?

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**4. TEST #3: Do you keep His commands? (1John 2:3-6)**  
 Which commands are we expected to keep? What does God give us to be able to do this? If we know we can't be perfect, how should we know if we pass this test?

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**5. TEST #4: Do you reject this evil world? (1 John 2:15-17)**  
 What does the word “world” mean in this context? How does it look like practically to reject the world? How does that play out in our interactions with unbelievers? Do we not love unbelievers because they are part of the world? What was Jesus' example?

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**6. TEST #5: Do you eagerly await the Lord's return? (1 John 3:2-3)**  
 Why is this a mark of a believer? What are some biblical examples of people who lived like this? How would eagerly awaiting the Lord's return affect the various areas of your life: your job, relationships, finances, evangelism, time management?

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**7. TEST #6: Do you see a decreasing pattern of sin in your life? (1 John 3:4-10)**  
 Why is growth so important in a believer's life? Can you look back on 2019 and see ways that you have grown this past year? What are some ways the Bible tells us to combat sin? How can growth in our life enhance our testimony?

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
