This is why it is important to share the Gospel with everyone, even here at CBC.

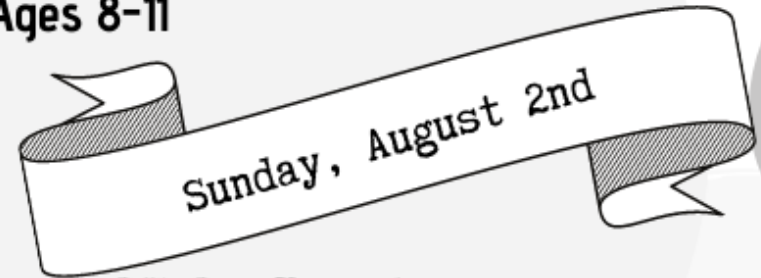
## >>HOW can you practice talking about the Gospel?

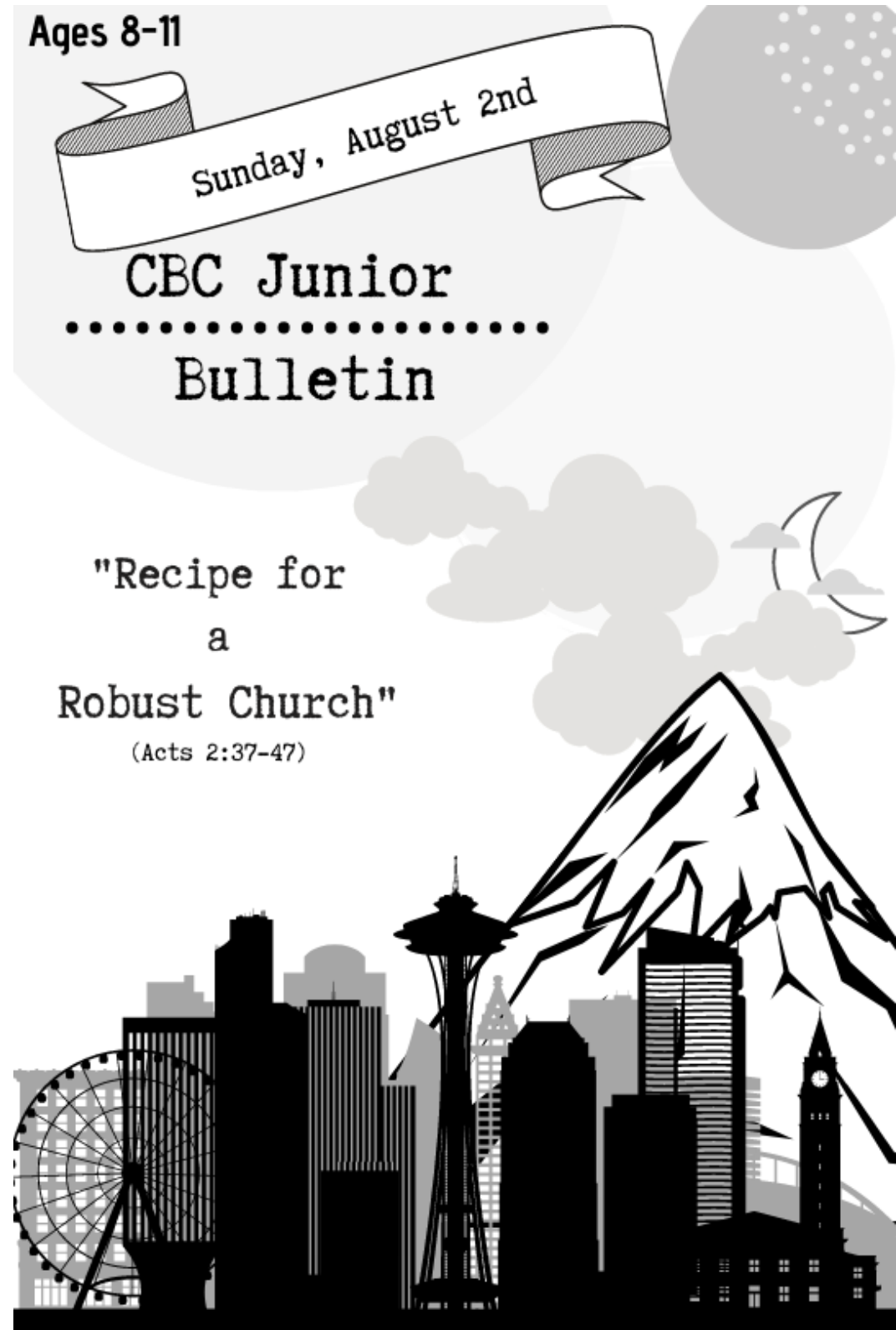

## “Recipe for a Robust Church”

(Acts 2:37-47)

### READ:

1) In the book of the Bible called “Acts of the Apostles”, there are many records of the first Christian churches. Today, Pastor Cary is preaching about what a healthy church will be like, based on the book of Acts. Cornerstone Bible Church wants to be a healthy church that honors God and shares the Gospel.

2) A couple weeks ago, you learned about the apostle Peter’s first sermon... the Gospel! After hearing the sermon, about 3,000 people believed in Jesus and were saved! In the very next verse, we read that these people began “devoting themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer”.

3) The first thing we notice is that these people, the “early church”, truly believed that Jesus came to save them from their sins. They had confessed their sin and been forgiven by God, and were given new hearts. These people were true Christians!

4) We also see that these people were “devoted” to doing what is right. They were excited to obey God, and practiced doing good. They worked hard to understand what the apostles preached about. They shared the Gospel with each other and talked about God together. They made sure to take Communion on a regular basis, to remember the sacrifice of Jesus. They prayed together often.

5) This church was a strong church, because they made GOD the center of their life every day. They wanted to think about Jesus and the Gospel all the time. They LOVED each other and built each other up. We should love our brothers and sisters like the early church did, because we love God more than anything.
